Policy No 2: Safeguarding

Purpose of the Policy

- To ensure that no harm comes to children or vulnerable adults as a result of our actions or non-actions.
- EGMEL's charitable purpose is to preserve the estate to be used by the residents of East
 Grinstead and surrounding areas for recreational and associated purposes. The estate is
 leased to municipal tenants. Consequently EGMEL has no direct safeguarding
 responsibility for day-to-day users of the estate. Our Policy reflects that context.

Policy

- Consistent with our objective of increasing diversity and accessibility we will accept
 applications from young people (age 16-18 years) to become Student Members. (See
 website for further information.). All applications will be subject to Board approval. We will
 liaise as appropriate with a young person's place of education and/or responsible adult prior
 to confirming student membership to ensure any relevant safeguarding requirements are
 addressed and implemented.
- On an exceptional basis, we may be approached by an educational or community
 organisation to assist in a young person's/vulnerable adult's development via a short-term
 project-based assignment. In such cases, we will ensure such development is undertaken
 in accordance with the sponsoring organisation's safeguarding policy. We will ensure that
 any Trustees directly involved will be subject to DBS clearance.
- · The Board will nominate a Trustee as Safeguarding Lead
